Glenbard East High School Class Attends Water Treatment Presentation and Tour at DuPage Water Commission

On March 14, 2014, a Glenbard East High School class of twenty students attended a water treatment presentation and tour of the DuPage Water Commission (DWC) pumping station.

Manager of Operations Terry McGhee presented the students with a background on the water treatment process and used Chicago's Jardine Water Purification Plant as an example. General Manager Spatz was also around to answer questions about Chicago's water department.

Then Operations Supervisor, Mike Weed, lead the students on a tour of the DWC pumping station to get a better understanding of how a pump station works.

The Water Conservation and Protection Program promotional materials that DWC hands out at events were given to the students to use at home to promote water conservation. These items included: water bottles, shower timers, rain gauges, leak detection tablets, magnets, and educational handouts.
