

DuPage Water Commission's Water Conservation and Protection Program Attends District 181 Foundation's Believe in Green

On Saturday, April 10th, DuPage Water Commission Water Preservation Group Member, Jenessa Nesbitt, was in attendance as an exhibitor for District 181 Foundation's 'Believe in Green' Green Fair. District 181 Foundation is an independent non-profit organization that offers interested community members an opportunity to directly support one of our community's most valuable assets --- our public schools.

This Green Fair had recycling on many items including bicycles, eyeglasses, crayons, batteries, and electronics; secure document shredding; eco-friendly cars; rain barrel silent auctions; raffles on green products, tickets, gift certificates, gift baskets, and specialty items; and park clean up. There were three large rooms full of exhibitors both vendors as well as non-profit organizations.

DWC's rain barrel and dual flush toilet were both present. Around 20 informational pamphlets about toilet leaks, lawncare, indoor/outdoor water use, and a water quiz were handed out. About 25 5-minute shower timers, 30 rain gauges, and 30 toilet leak detection tablets were distributed.
