## Preserving Every Drop Attends DuPage County's Cool DuPage Press Conference

Last Tuesday, Preserving Every Drop Member Jenessa Rodriguez attended DuPage County's Cool DuPage Press Conference. Cool DuPage is a county-wide initiative aimed to reduce energy consumption and improve air quality. Homeowners, businesses and public agencies are encouraged to help preserve the environment and save money. By doing their part in the Sierra Club's national "Cool Counties" initiative, DuPage hopes to reduce greenhouse gas emissions 10% by 2020 and 20% by 2030.

DuPage County invited companies and non-for-profits to exhibit energy-saving information for board Commissioners and County employees. Some of the other exibitors included Morton Arboretum, Nicor Gas, ComEd, The Conservation Foundation, and SCARCE.

Preserving Every Drop promotional materials were handed out to board members, board meeting attendees, and employees. These items included: shower timers, rain gauges, leak detection tablets, and educational handouts.
